

#### New Arizona legislation extends tax credit deadline to April 15th

Beginning with the 2016 tax year, credit eligible contributions made to a Qualifying Charitable Organization made on or before April 15th may be applied to either the current or the preceding taxable year and is considered to have been made on the last day of that taxable year.



What does that mean? You can still reduce your taxes for 2016 by making a gift to Child & Family Resources on or before April 15, 2017!

You can donate up to \$400 (for single filers) or \$800 (for joint filers) to qualify for the Arizona Charitable Tax Credit. The Arizona Charitable Tax Credit is in addition to, and completely separate from, the Private School Tuition, Public School Activity, and Foster Care tax credits—you may participate in any or all four if you choose.
