### MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT & CEO

### As you have been reading throughout this report, the 2022-23 fiscal year has been one of enormous success and pride at CFR.

The organization has emerged strong and vibrant from the pandemic years, and we are grateful to all of our staff who have managed to creatively find ways to serve and support clients over the last few years. Here are just a few of the many highlights of the past year:

- Achieved four-year reaccreditation from the Council of Accreditation and for the first time with a perfect score and no recommended findings to address.
- Opening offices and/or expanding services to a variety of smaller communities across the state including Globe, Willcox, Tuba City, Colorado City, San Luis, Pinal County to name a handful.
- Successfully competed for new and renewal grant awards from First Things First, whose contracts were all rebid and awarded this year.
- Expanded the depth and breadth of our teen services leading the way to provide much needed substance abuse, pregnancy, and suicide prevention programming to youth.
- Being a leading voice in advocating for higher quality early childhood education and expanded funding
- Being a well-respected member of so many local and statewide coalitions and task forces
- Enhancing our financial stability and growing our reserves to a level commensurate with our size and scope

What are the challenges that lie ahead? The growing number of children and adolescents with unmet mental health needs is fast becoming an epidemic. Too many young people are emerging from the pandemic years scarred, depressed, in despair, or challenged in other ways. If our mission at CFR is to build strong communities where children can reach their full potential, then we are called upon to do more for Arizona's elementary and secondary school aged children. Traditional models of individual counseling are not sufficient to address the need; we have ideas for school and community based early interventions such as mobile mental health vans that can reach underserved areas.

Thank you for understanding the return on investment of prevention and early intervention services, and for your support of the multitude of vital niche the CFR plays in Arizona.
